In mid-November, the California Transit Association's (CTA) 58th Annual Fall Conference and Expo was co-hosted by Access, the City of Pasadena, and Foothill Transit. The event took place at the Pasadena Convention Center in Pasadena, California.

The three-day program, highlighted by keynote speakers like CNN contributor and activist Van Jones, featured several comprehensive educational sessions showcasing speakers who discussed the future of the transit industry in California. This year's theme, "Connecting Us," invited critical connections to be made at the conference, which will lead to new opportunities and long-lasting relationships amongst California transit agencies to help steadily advance the future of our industry.
